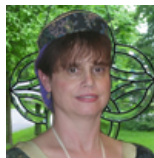

Finally, we warmly thank Spyke and Sigg, past knight marshal and past chate-laine, for their dedication to the Barony for the past several

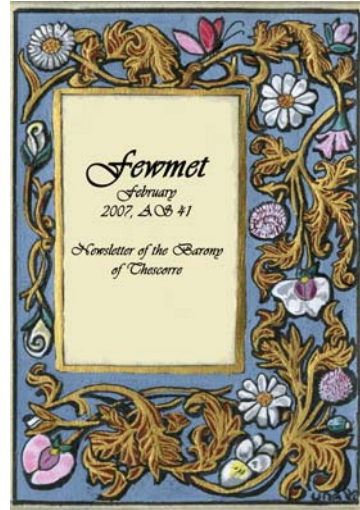

Being the Report of the Court of Their Majesties, Christopher and Morgen, King and Queen of Æthelmearc, with His Highness, Rurik, Prince of Æthelmearc in attendance. Court held on 13 January AS 41 (2007), at Æthelmearc Twelfth Night in Their Shire of Hartstone. Baron Fridrikr Tomasson av Knusslig Hamn, reporting herald, with the assistance of THLady Matilda Bosvyle de Belle Aqua.

Their Majesties and His Highness, Prince Rurik, invited Lady Renata Rouge, Seneschal of Hartstone into court. Lady Renata thanked many fine gentles who worked in the preparations for the day. She cited in particular one gentle, Luke, who did many and varied tasks. His Highness invited young Luke, age 2 and one half, into court and made him a present of a fine shield and body armor, and Her Majesty presented him with a fine toy. After a brief discussion of the lack of a sword in Luke's fighting kit, court continued.

Their Majesties announced that due to the generosity of the kind folk of Æthelmearc, over 350 toys had been collected for Toys for Tots.

Their Majesties thanked the Kingdom Bards who unfortunately could not attend, and called upon Gwendolyn the Graceful, Brehyres to announce the outcome of the Kingdom Bards' competition. Eight good and talented gentles competed. Their Majesties then named THLord Dagonell Collingwood of Emerald Lake as Kingdom Bard and invested him with the regalia of his office.

Their Majesties invited Lady Portia de Sancto Lucianno into court and created her a Companion of the Keystone for her excellent service to her local group and her Kingdom, most especially to the Æstel. Scroll by Her Excellency, Una de Saint Luc.

Their Majesties invited Gwendolyn the Graceful, Brehyres into court and noted her great service to the Kingdom through the Bardic College of Æthelmearc. They then invited the Noble Order of the Millrind into court and elevated Her Excellency to the Order to the great acclaim of the Companions thereof. Scroll by THLady Pleasance de Coignieres.

Their Majesties invited Dona Illadore de Bedagrayne into Their court. They noted her long and distinguished service to the Barony- Marche of the Debatable Lands and the College of Cour d'Or and to the fencing community and elevated her to the Noble Order of the Millrind. Their Majesties gifted her with the title and dignity of a Baroness of the Court. Millrind scroll by Her Excellency, Una de Saint Luc; Court Barony scroll by THLady Aerin Teine.

Their Majesties invited the Most Noble Order of the Pelican into Their court. They inquired of the Order whether they had spoken with the two candidates for elevation and were assured that the Order had done so. Their Majesties then invited the candidates into their court.

Their Majesties summoned Mistress Rhiannon y Bwa into Their Court. Mistress Rhiannon entered to the harmony of fine horns and wearing her personal crest atop her "very nice hat". She agreed to Their Majesties' offer of elevation. Her Excellency, Katja Davidova Orlova Khazarina spoke kind words of the joy of service. Mistress Rhiannon was then elevated to the estate of the Most Noble Order of the Pelican. Scroll by THLady Alheydis von Korckhingen, upon a text by Her Excellency, Daedra McBeth a Gryphon.

I. Officers Reports

- **Exchequer:** Alina announced that she submitted the year-end report, and we ended with a surplus of \$903.22. (Yay!) We have \$3112.07b in savings

and \$2331.38 in checking. (Note: I reported at the social that Alina can't attend socials during tax season. She actually said that if needed to provide a check, she can attend if asked beforehand.)

- **Chronicler:** The January issue of the Fewmet is online now, Mairghread said. She welcomes any interviews, event reports, articles, puzzles, artwork, etc.
- **Youth Marshal:** Mairghread and Nivah are involved in an ongoing discussion with Callidus about possi-

bly allowing 16- and 17-year-olds to fight heavy weapons with other 16- and 17-year-olds. (Mairghread wrote later to explain that Toni, the third at-large Youth Marshall residing in Thescorre is also involved in discussion as are all Kingdom YM's throughout the spring.)

- **Rapier:** We've had one practice so far this month, Yasmina said. Regarding her search for a site to hold an Æthelmearc Academy of the Rapier event, she finally heard back from the owner of the Main Street

Armory. The rate for the arena, plus several rooms would be \$1,000. The owner hopes to have an onsite restaurant up and running by May, which is when Yasmina hopes to hold the event. She plans to have an event bid ready by the next social meeting. She's looked at other sites, including the Salem Church on Bittner. It's a wonderful site but not at all handicapped accessible. It would cost \$500 for two rooms, and might be good for another event. There is a

regional fencing practice this weekend in Delftwood.

- **Steward:** We have stuff, it lives in my basement, Steffan noted. If you have any baronial stuff, please give it back to him. If you keep any baronial stuff, please let him know so he can list it in the inventory. Katja asked if he wanted an inventory of the baronage regalia, which Steffan did, and commented that she and Eric had recently discovered they had a "box of Bobs," which appeared to be baronial camping stuff and at least five ravens. She won-

dered when it had last been used at Pennsic; Fridrikr joked that it had probably been years.

- **Archery:** We have loaner equipment, Cedric reported. We have festive targets and are planning a Valentine's Day Shoot.

- **Baroness:** Katja praised Rhianon, Gwen, and Portia for receiving service awards at Twelfth Night (Pelican, Millrind, and Keystone, respectively). She added that she hoped everyone had a lovely time in

our sister group, Hartstone; she reminded all members of the Raven's Feather, Black Talon, and Broche that if they haven't voted yet on the current polling and wish to, they should contact her or Eric ASAP.

- **Heraldry:** I'm working with Collette to get her arms changed, Matilda said. She thanked Fridrikr for agreeing to revive the commenting group, which will meet on the second Tuesday in February to

review current heraldic submissions.

- **MOL:** No new business since Champs, Bronwyn said.

- **Chirurgion:** Phillipe was the chi in charge of Twelfth Night last weekend. He still plans to create a chi website.

- **Historian:** I'm looking for stuff, Phillipe added.

- **Webministers:** The webpage is running smoothly, as is the online Fewmet. If you don't have a Thescorre

email address and you'd like to, Sorcha said, we have plenty.

- **Chatelaine:** We haven't had any local or regional chatelaine practices, Dubheasa joked. I have the gold key in the attic, and I've agreed to do this for two more years. (Yay!) I've talked to five newbies since my last report!

- **A&S:** The arts are going strong, Kadlin said. We have regular practices and meetings of all the guilds.

3. Recruitment

Peregrine opened a discussion about recruitment of new members. We need to start thinking of ways that will help us more directly, she said, praising the chatelaines for all the educational demos they've organized. Cedric had cultivated some newbies at RIT last year, but we never heard from them again after break. What can we do to keep people interested? she asked.

Siggy noted that he has another boy scout demo scheduled for Monday, Feb. 26 from 7:30 to 9 p.m. It's an ADEPT-style demo for 11- to 18-year-olds. He added that past scouts have joined the SCA when they go away to college, and we have get students to join while here.

Someone mentioned the demos we did years ago at the Memorial Art Gallery. Those were good efforts; should we do those again?

We need to get back to the campuses, Siggy said. We have lots of colleges in this area and they get the best results. How many of us found the SCA while in college? he asked. He suggested looking at MCC first, since the students there tend to be more relaxed while those at UR and RIT tend to be more focused on their studies. He added that the University of Brockport and St. John Fisher were also good possibilities. "We're an anomaly" for an SCA group, he added, "We have so many colleges in our area and no activity on campus."

Yasmina noted that Anna, Don and Willa's oldest daughter, is considering resurrecting Raven's Nest. Rather than pursue trying to set up groups at each college, she suggested talking to the student activity boards at each school and doing demos at the various seasonal campus festivals. She also recommended getting faculty advisors involved.

Sorcha commented that she first learned about the Society not at her college but at an Earth Day celebration that urged environmentalists to enjoy the times before electronics. We should check out several alternative festivals, she recommended, not just the schools. Carlo chimed in, agreeing that is a connection between SCAdians and "your average hippy." Dehka nodded, adding that she's always seeing interest in the belly-dance community and at the henna festivals she attends.

Ryan, who is a student at MCC, offered to gather information on the festival schedules, and to find out if we can put up posters on campus. Solveig stressed starting groups at the campuses, saying that colleges are very focused on providing activities for their students. Siggy cautioned that we need to get our foot in the door with publicity, not jump immediately into starting campus groups. Mairghread countered that in order to have a table/display in autumn events fairs, your group generally has to be a campus organization. Fridrikr suggested trying to get one or two people on each campus in order to qualify for being a student interest group, and added that we can also look at Hobart, Keuka, and Geneseo.

Cedric related his experience trying to drum up interest at a college recently, where he manned a table, ran into a requirement for a \$25 million insurance policy to cover renting a room, and found that posters he hung one day were ripped down the next by cleaning staff. He also noted that student newspapers don't seem to be worthwhile as a way to reach students nowadays; Solveig concurred that they weren't widely read.

Tracking Down Twelfth Night Cakes

Cooking with Katja, 2/2007

How do I find the answer to some of the food questions I'm asked? In essence, how do I research something? That question has come up from time to time, so I thought it would be fun to explain how research on some subjects can be at least started on the Internet and why it's valuable to have more than just a good library at your fingertips.

Bryn contacted me a few days before Twelfth Night, telling me that Rowan, the head cook for the upcoming event feast, wanted to resurrect the old SCA custom of hiding a coin or token in a bun or cake so that the gentle who found it would be named the King of Misrule.

I well remember this from the first couple of feasts I attended, but I hadn't seen it done in almost two decades. Bryn had the same thought as I did: was it a documentably period practice or just one of the various early SCA customs we later realized were actually Victorian (like

Although Google can be an extremely valuable tool for beginning a research project, just searching for "hidden food" revealed links only on allergy concerns while "coins in food" or "king of misrule" resulted in nothing relevant. Wikipedia did contain a decent, brief history of the "lord of misrule" dating back to ancient Roman times, but didn't mention anything about coins hidden in food; the entry on Twelfth Night explained only on the Shakespeare play. I concluded that basic search engines weren't going to be of any help here.

So, I went to more food history-specific archives and search engines: www.Florilegium.org. A collection of SCA articles and postings from various listserves on lots of medieval history subjects, it's often a great way to begin a search and determine what sources exist (although not every file or comment contains citations, so this must be used cautiously). To my surprise, it was a complete dead end. Another excellent repository of SCA feasts and food articles, www.GodeCookery.com, had tons of valuable information on food history but nothing on this subject.

Next, I used links on the Æthelmearc Cooks Guild website (<http://www.medievalcooking.org/aecooksindex.html>) to quickly review a number of academic websites for articles and online translations of period manuscripts:

- Cindy Renfrew's online culinary sources <http://www.thousandeggs.com/cookbooks.html>,

Fast and Feast by Bridget Ann Henisch covers almost everything known about English dining customs during the Middle Ages. Terence Scully's The Art of Cookery in the Middle Ages covers all the bases on medieval cooking techniques and food. Were either helpful? Nope. I skimmed through Roy Strong's Feast: A History of Grand Eating, but even that treatise on dining throughout the

centuries failed to help here.

With trepidation, I consulted my least-favorite source: Madeleine Pelner Cosman's Fabulous Feasts. A book infamous for text that ranges from overly general to highly detailed, a lack of footnotes or other clear citations, and completely inaccurate, untested, and undocumented redactions, it's one that I personally despise for causing so many to think period

eating in the dark by candlelight) or otherwise not common during our period of study? Rowan was busy with last-minute food preparations for the feast; could we document this for her?

Since I was at work at the time that Bryn contacted me, what could I do from there, quickly, to verify or debunk the practice? I didn't have an immediate answer and I couldn't think of a specific academic or SCA article off the top of my head that explored the subject. I figured checking out Twelfth Night and Carnivale customs would be a good start.

I well remember this from the first couple of feasts I attended

- Professor Gloning's dietetic and culinary texts <http://homepage.univie.ac.at/thomas.gloning/kobu.htm>,
- the Labyrinth at Georgetown University <http://labyrinth.georgetown.edu>, and the Bodleian Library at the University of Oxford <http://www.bodleian.ox.ac.uk/dept/scwmss/wmss/medieval>.

Still nothing. Hmm. Okay, this is going to be a challenge... I told Bryn I'd have to check out my books when I got home that night.

What's the best paper source for beginning a food history project? The Oxford English Dictionary is great for determining the first use of any word and Alan Davidson's Oxford Companion to Food contains wonderfully detailed entries solely on culinary subjects. Neither had anything on Twelfth Night food or food with coins hidden inside. Okay, now I'm really intrigued and bordering on stumped...

food tastes nasty. Like many SCAians, it was one of the first food history books I bought simply because it was easily available and I didn't know any better. Although the recipes should be ripped out and tossed, I know that some of the text does contain decent information, specifically on feast customs. So, I flipped through it. I was almost relieved that it did not help. I really did not want to tell Rowan to check out FF...

I thumbed through my reprints of *Forme of Cury* and *A Proper Newe Booke of Cokerie*, 14th and 16th Century English food manuscripts. Nothing jumped out and I didn't have the time to do a lengthy, thorough review of all the manuscripts I have. What could I do in the time I had? Even if I had more time, I'd gone through all the major analytical sources I have for starting a research project... did I even think I could find it with the materials I had? What could I do? Katrina has something in the works; nothing to report yet.

3. College of Three Ravens

Fridrikr was taking reservations at the meeting; Orianna is the reservationist for the event. Things are moving along well, he said. We have 12 classes scheduled, so we're about half full. There are some problems with event staff emails in the event announcement on the kingdom website not forwarding correctly. Orianna had suggested direct email to Kadlin, Bryn, Olivia, and Bronwyn to resolve this, Fridrikr said. Instead, Sorcha suggested setting up a temporary email (something like C3Rteachers@Thescore.org) that would forward to the event staff and would hide their personal emails from spambots and spiders. Fridrikr asked for a \$600 advance for the cooks, who are working on the budget and menu.

The King and Queen plan on attending, and have issued a writ to Alienor Russeal to be inducted into the Laurel at the event. The rough schedule for the event is classes during the day with the vigil in the afternoon, court from 4:30 to 5, feast at 6, dancing at 8, and site cleanup at 9. He needs to talk to Mea about the tortoise scrolls. The signup sheets for troll and other event help will be passed around at the social meeting. Please sign up for the feast soon, as he suspects we will fill the hall rapidly.

Check the Thescore list for different meeting locations. The Cooks Guild is busy preparing for College of Three Ravens. She added that a friend of hers is interested in starting a concert of recorders. She also announced that her father had given her and Siggy a "cow" so they have lots of leather for projects at social meetings, such as award medallions. They could also make cookie cutters, if they knew what designs would be useful. Katja suggested Broches, Feathers, and Talons.

- **Seneschale:** Peregrine attended Curia the morning after Twelfth Night. Nothing specifically affected Thescore, but there is an important proposal to allow certain kingdom offices to receive reimbursement for reasonable travel expenses to certain kingdom-level events, with prior approval. For example, the seneschale could get re-

imbursed for Curia, Coronation, and Crown; other possible officers include the Silver Buccle, earl marshal, and MOL, although they are not the only ones eligible. Solveig pointed out that the reason behind this proposal was to encourage more people to consider taking a Great Office by reducing some of the financial burden.

- Peregrine also reported on several proposed Pennsic improvements, such as a new field pavilion, period-style tables, and new thrones for the heirs. There is also a proposal for local groups to have their own set of royalty thrones. Katja commented that she could understand this, since it would make traveling much easier on Their Majesties. Fridrikr agreed that packing thrones can be challenging, and this would be very

convenient for the Crown.

- Next month is baronial Curia. Are there any proposals? Peregrine asked. <crickets> There were none.
- There are two candidates for knight marshal, Peregrine announced: Spyke and Vettius. She recessed the meeting to hand out slips of paper in order to get random names for officers and non-officers for an officer selection committee. Per Katja's request, Peregrine read Vettius' officer bid so that those present at the meeting could hear what the committee would consider. Since Spyke is the current officer, he did not have fill out a bid form and none was present at the meeting. The committee, comprised of Peregrine, Eldjarn, Alina, Karen, Steffan, and Katja

Simple. Go "above my head." Contact someone else who has better resources and more research experience.

In other words, go the library. Or, in this instance, go to a librarian!


I know of a lady in the MidRealm, from the SCA-Cooks list, who is a former research librarian and has been studying medieval food history for over 30 years. She uses academic search engines that folks who don't work for universities or libraries can't access, plus owns hundreds and hundreds of food history texts. She tracks down research questions on the list all the time, and I had met her at a food history symposium several years ago. So, I emailed THL Johnnae Ilyn Lewis, explained the timing and question, listed which sources I'd consulted, and asked if she knew of any sources that would verify or debunk this practice?

In a matter of hours, Johnnae had uncovered three pre-1600 citations for Twelfth Night cakes baked with a bean, pea, or coin inside, plus more dating through the 17th Century. I thanked her heartily, told Bryn the good news, then printed off the best source to show Rowan the next day so that she could follow through with her plans, confident that she was sharing a custom that actually existed from our period of study.

The point to this column? **Everyone** hits a rock wall in his or her research at some point and doesn't know how to proceed. Libraries and subject experts exist to share their knowledge. Ask them to help... and don't forget to thank them and pay them fair attribution! <smile>

The mistris of the house is she that ... the cake, into the which when she kneads it, she puts a small peece of siluer, then ... it vpon the harth, she cuts it into as many peeces as there are persons in the house, ... giues to every one his part: yet there are certaine peeces assigned, first one to Christ, ... to the Virgin Marie, and last to the three wise men that came to worship him; and ... hese parts are giuen to the poore: he that hath that part wherein the peece of siluer aines, is saluted as king, set in a chaire, and raised vp thrice by the whole companie ... great cries of ioy. ..."
