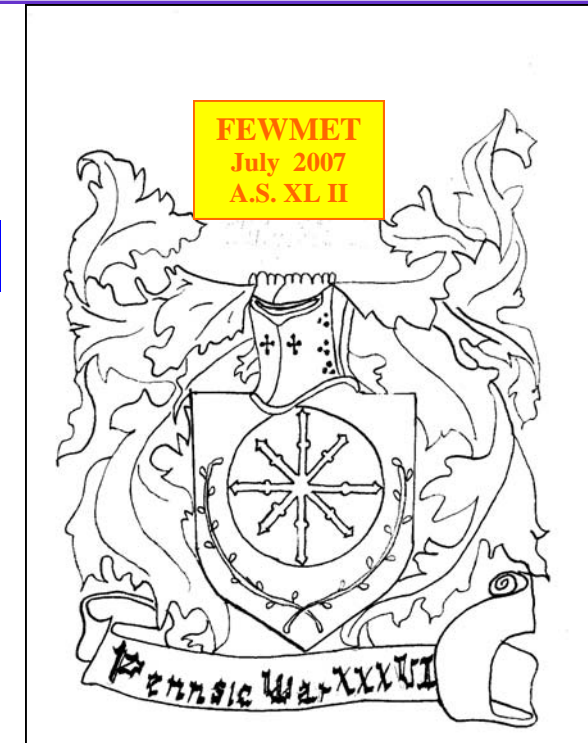


## From the Baron and Baroness

### **Thescorre Social Meeting Notes** by Baroness Katja

Collette showed gentles how to make a very simple, attractive, and useful scroll case out a yard or so of fabric and two pieces of cardboard. The fabric is folded over the two pieces in a book fold (with the raw edges turned under), then two straight seams are sewn along the bottom and top. Several folks helped iron and fold the fabric, while Kadlin and Collette sewed the seams on two sewing machines. This design allows you to remove the cardboard so that the cover can be washed (if the fabric gets dirty) or the cardboard replaced (if the cardboard get bent or wet).

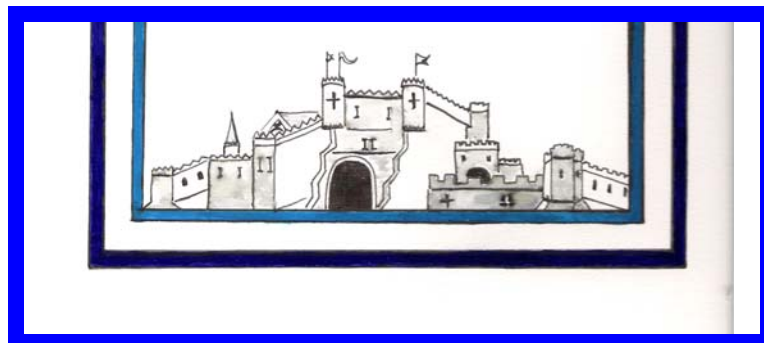
Lady Katrina of York, the event Autocrat, spoke words of thanks to many whom helped make the event a success.

## A Virtual Weed Walk

Lady Nivah was gracious enough to conduct an impromptu weedwalk through her lovely herb garden just in time for summer cooking, crafts and Pennsic classes (that may get taken or marked off in the Pennsic guide and missed!). Note that many of these herbs are poisonous so DO NOT use them as described in this article. Herbs known to be in use during period were visited during this stroll.

Holly of course was used by pagan and Christian religions in symbolism ranging from power to suffering. The



name does not come from holy but from the Middle English word holin.

Foxglove or digitalis is a beautiful flowering plant long known as a heart medication. Legend tells of fairies living in the blooms.

Beebalm or bergamot is in the mint family as was used as a tea. It is known as a diuretic amongst many other medicinal uses.



Lady's Mantle is also known as Rosaceae. The leaves have pleated folds said to represent the cape that may have protected the Virgin Mary. It was know by other old names such as Lion's Foot, Bear's Foot and Nine Hooks. One use was for reduction of swelling.



Yarrow or Staunchweed signifies health and war. It was used as a salad green but has fallen taste. Infusions were told to lovesick girls.

Columbine also called by the used as an astringent but can be

**Thescorre Business Meeting Notes** by Baroness Katja

6/19/2007 Donal & Sorcha's home

Eldjarn, emergency backup seneschal

17 Thescorreans present, plus four children and three starved-for-attention cats

1. Officer reports

Herald: Nothing to report, said Eldjarn, speaking for Pleasance.

Historian & Chirurgeon: Phillipe also had nothing to report, Eldjarn added.

Heavy Weapons: Practices are once again outside at the Rec Center on Mondays starting from 7 p.m., Vettius reported. We've lost a portion of the people who came to fight practice, so he said he was more than willing to help out anyone who wants to come but doesn't have armor. He added that he has repaired the old loaner gear, but hadn't been bringing it to practice because it wasn't needed. He will bring it from now on.

Rapier: Yasmina said that fencing is continuing outside at the Center from 6:30 until dark, also on Mondays. We had one new fencer (Isaac) who showed up last week, learned some footwork, then showed up this week with a new doublet and pants that he sewed himself!! (Gentles applauded his enthusiasm) We have loaner gear and plenty of space, save the occasional soccer ball rolling into our area.

Nothing new to report on the Rapier Academy, she added, other than the site owner asked if we would consider changing the date to accommodate another potential site renter; she said no since our event is already scheduled. They talked briefly about the possibility of us doing an equestrian event too, she continued, "but in process of the conversation it occurred to me that he wanted a Medieval Times kind of thing. I told him that's not exactly what our equestrian folks do, but I can put you in touch with them and maybe you can work something out." She added that the restaurant will be up and running by the time of the rapier academy event. Roberta made flyers to hand out at 10 Year and Pax.

Arts & Sciences: We made seven scroll cases at the last social meeting, Kadlin said, learning how to make them very easily with a yard of scrap fabric. The July social will be the traditional swap of fabric and garb. Kadlin could use more deputies. "The job is to find out what people know and what others want to know, and put them together. It's fun!"

Chatelaine: Dubheasa has been busy with a lot of online requests, encouraging people to attend meetings and practices. She still has loaner garb in the attic.

As for Pax, she needs some kitchen help. She thanked those who helped make spinach tarts last week and asked for helpers this coming week to make soup on Saturday.

(Laughing interlude as one of the cats casually walked from lap to lap to yet another lap across the couches and then nosed down into Alina's purse...)

Exchequer: We have \$1,840.80 in checking and \$3,155.29 in savings, Alina said. The checking account is lower than normal because there's \$1,500 in advances out for events.

Webministers: Sorcha, some new people on the list, Fewmet is up. If you see that something on the calendar or other webpages needs to be updated, Donal added, please let us know.

Seneschal: Joe recently informed Peregrine that all of Rochester's recreation centers are beefing up their security this fall, Eldjarn announced. They will require anyone who uses their facilities to only enter with passkeys. Therefore, they want us to fully fill out medical information sheets so that if you fall ill at a meeting, they know your medical needs. This change is city-wide, not just for the Adams Street center. Any new member of any organization or activity that uses the recreation centers can be brought in once by an existing member, but then they need to fill out the medical form and get a passkey for any future visits. What if a newcomer finds us on the webpage and just shows up at a meeting, like Isaac did, without first contacting the chatelaine or any other member? Katja asked. Won't this discourage folks from participating? Yasmina recommended that the seneschal or someone else arrive at meetings and practices early and wait by the door to greet new folks. Katja added, from talking to Isaac, that perhaps we need to add a very clear, explicit invitation on the homepage for those interested in joining to contact the chatelaine (and include a note that they will need a passkey to participate in practices at the center).

July 17 is Baronial Curia; all officers must submit reports by that meeting.

Baron & Baroness: We will be able to go to Pennsic!! Eric announced. We expect to hold Baronial Court on Monday of War Week in camp again, Katja noted. Further, Eric continued, we want to see all the folks who plan to fence, fight, shoot, or throw for the barony (at Pennsic) to stand up and be recognized at Pax. We will have a short ceremony on the battlefield at noon on Saturday. Otherwise, Katja said, everyone please come to Pax and have fun!

Dance & Drum: We're meeting at Eldjarn's tomorrow night.

Threadworkers: We're next meeting on July 14 at Pleasances to work on any projects we have, Matilda said. We plan to meet at Pennsic, and Alison is coordinating that meeting.

Brewers: We're having an unofficial meeting at Pax, Sorcha said, adding they'll be taste-testing the key lime cordial she made.

Cooks Guild: We met last Saturday and will be meeting this coming Saturday, Dubheasa said, to cook stuff for Pax. Thanks to everyone who has been helping!

Scribal: We'll be doing heraldry on the first Wednesday in July, Matilda said.

Court and Country Dance: We have a surplus of lords! We need more ladies! Dubheasa joked.

## 2. Old business

All three officers for the offices that expire in July have agreed to continue serving another term.

## 3. Pax

Katrina sent around sign-up sheets around the room; everything is going fine and Julianna is taking reservations, but we need more volunteers. We still need shade for the field.

Vettius related something that he thought worked really well at the Æthelmearc 10 Year event: the event MOL sat at troll and when a fighter or fencer showed her their authorization card, she put a sticker on their site token. That way, the martial participants didn't have to bring their wallets to the battlefield. It also kept the folks honest, he said, since it proved they paid to get into the event. Are we having site tokens for the event, he asked? No, we didn't plan for them, Katrina replied. Katja noted that we have not included tokens in the costs of event for the last couple of years, so as to save money. Both Sorcha and Katja noted that cloth tokens could be made very cheaply and quickly, if he wanted. Katrina recommended that Vettius talk to Bronwyn; if she were willing to sit at Troll and has volunteers to help her check the authorizations, go ahead and set it up.

Several folks offered to lend flies for the field, including Yasmina and Vettius; someone asked if the barony has any sunblock or bugspray for events.

"Should we consider buying a barony sunshade?" Eric asked. We have enough summer activities that it seems like it would be worthwhile. He suggested something like the canvas lean-to Roberta uses at events, but others recommended a 12x12 or 10x29 sunshade or carport, perhaps with a painted canvas cover. Discussion ensued as to the costs of buying a shade or cover from Panther versus several people sewing one. Alina noted that the barony checking account has been depleted by recent events; others suggested holding a fundraiser for the shade. Fridrikr noted that a 10x20 carport and a handmade cover would cost only about \$500. Kadlin added she knows how to use fabric paint. Juliana recommended ensuring that, if we do buy a carport, get one with a UV cover so that it provides more protection from the sun. Fridrikr praised the construction of some shades in the Yama Kaminari encampment. Yes, but could a large shade live in Steffan's basement? Katja asked. (She called Steffan, and he said he'd make room if the project occurs.) These are great ideas and this sounds like a good project, Eldjarn summarized. It sounds like it has some support. Anyone want to check out the costs and consider how to organize this? (crickets....)

## 4. New business

Eldjarn offered his official proposal for a dance event in September. He proposed holding it at the Adams Street Center at no cost, no feast, and no troll, so there would be no charge. He hopes have 40 to 50 attendants. The event would have dance instructors (primarily him and Peregrine). He asked for \$50 budget for refreshments (drinks), and said he encouraged attendants to bring an item to a potluck buffet afterward. The event would be September 29, 10 a.m. to 8 p.m. in the gymnasium.

Based on the discussion earlier, attendants will have to have passkeys or Eldjarn will have to ask Joe whether the

won't need them. The event would be listed in the AEstel as an event, not a demo. There won't be a site fee, but donations will be accepted. Fridrikr questioned whether the event would conflict with Harvest Raid, and recommended that it would be fairly easy to get permission from Herontir to conflict with their event. Yasmina asked what would be the difference between the event and a regional dance practice? Fridrikr explained that there were certain regulations that had to be followed for an event as opposed to a dance practice; for example, the local senechale must be in attendance at an event and the event must be announced in the local newsletter.

Those present approved the event bid 11-0-3.

Carlo reminded everyone about a fundraiser/demo this weekend in Angels Keep to help a 10-year-old boy with renal failure. Several of us are going to participate and represent the barony, he said, so come and join us.

Fridrikr noted that Crown tourney will happen here in October. We need to determine the exact route from the site to the nearest hospital, in case Her then-Majesty goes into labor.

The event is being held at Wild Wood Sports Center, 5740 Fikes Rd., Elbridge, NY 13060. The owners ask that no pets be brought on site, and if service animals are needed please keep them leashed.

#### Directions:

These directions are to avoid construction and delays caused by the New York State Fair on RT 690.

#### >From the South:

Take 81 North to exit 15, Lafayette. The off ramp will merge into RT 11. At the light turn right onto RT 20, towards Skaneateles. Stay on RT 20 for approx. 17 miles. Make a Right turn on 321 North. Stay on 321 for 8.5 miles until you come to a light. Take a left at the light. You are now on RT 5. Continue on RT 5 for 2 miles. Make a right onto Fikes Rd. and the site is less than a half mile on the right.

#### >From the North:

Take 81 South to exit 30, Cicero, Bridgeport. You want to take a right. This puts you on RT 31. Continue on 31 to Baldwinsville. Once in the village of Baldwinsville you want to take a left at the second light. This is RT 48. Stay on 48 for half a mile. Turn right on Downer St. Downer St. turns back

into RT 31. Stay on 31 for 6-7 miles. Turn left onto Laird Rd. Stay on Laird for 1.5 when you veer onto the right and take an immediate left turn onto Fikes St. Stay on Fikes for 1.2 miles and site will be on your left.

>From the East or West:
