Recruitment Updates

Peregrine opened the meeting by asking for status reports on the action items taken at the recruitment meeting.

Insider Newspaper: Katja summarized that this is a weekly entertainment tabloid -- produced by the Democrat & Chronicle -- oriented toward 20 somethings, featuring a detailed calendar of community happenings; the content is both in print and online. She presented suggested wording for short briefs in several different categories of the calendar (covering our martial and gentle arts activities, as well as our meetings). She added that it was not entirely clear, from the answer she got when she contacted the newspaper, whether responding to the calendar request email would cover both the print and online and how often we would need to email to get recurring activities listed (such as every week, or just once a month?).

R-News: Peregrine checked out the scrolling calendar on both the website and the

cable channel. For the online listings, she learned that we could just email them once a month to get all of our activities listed. The broadcast ones would have to be rotated due to space limitations, and again we have to email once a month.

ROC-Loop: Kadlin explored this new website (also under the parentage of the D&C) designed to help college students learn about things in the area (such as Wegmans, the Can O' Worms, and garbage plates). It's done by and for students, so she said we would need to get a student or alumni to write an article on the SCA.

City Newspaper: Yasmina said this weekly alternative newspaper has both an online and a print calendar; it has a neat feature where you can search for events as well as click to fill out a form to add items to the calendar. Like Insider, it has a number of different categories and a wide array of topics for our activities. There was nothing specific on the calendar instructions on how to add a recurring event. While investigating this, she wondered about whether the barony would consider paying for a classified ad in the newspaper, say for

a special event? She doesn't have the details on how much how many lines would cost, but she could find out if the group is interested.

In related news: Donald Harefoot was interviewed in an article on Iraq War veterans in a recent City Newspaper. Also, Willa is running for reelection to the City School Board of Education.

University of Rochester: Eldjarn learned that we missed the college's big activity weekend for this year, but he may approach the medieval group to see if it would like us to do some demonstrations.

Monroe Community College: Sigvaldi said two of the college clubs looked promising but he unfortunately learned they were now defunct. He plans to check with the history department to see if it would like us to do a demonstration or class.

We can get our activities listed in City and Insider very easily and quickly, Peregrine said; those present voted with a simple majority to go ahead and submit items to those newspapers calendars. She reported that we discussed ideas for recruitment and publicity literature at the last social meeting, but have not finalized or created anything yet. Sigvaldi offered the layouts for his boy scout troupe's recruitment literature as a template.

Mairghread described a great SCA group brochure in a deli just off campus she saw when she visited her daughter at Columbia last weekend. It was a color trifold pamphlet with a lot of very useful information and photos of the viceroy and vicereine of Ostgardr. She noted that the color made it really stand out from the various other brochures in the deli. Sorcha agreed that "color definitely grabs your eye!"

We don't have a media contact yet for Crown, Orianna reported.

Katja heard on WXXI radio that non-profit community groups can list their activities free of charge in the Rochester Cultural Calendar; she handed Peregrine a printout of the RCC webpage.

She added that she found a number of articles online regarding how to run different kinds of SCA demos, how to handle publicity, newcomers, etc. One included the strong recommendation that a group seeking new members have activities *immediately* ready for newcomers to jump into (garbmaking work-

shops, armormaking sessions, etc.).

She asked that we discuss *how* to talk to newcomers and the media, especially at demos, so that we don't scare them off by "datadumping" too much information on them too soon.

2. Crown

We're taking reservations, Orianna reported, and I have all the pavilions I need for the event. She got permission to use the kingdom viewing stand for Their Majesties to use during the day. The expected schedule is: site opens at 10, list opens at 11, tourney begins at Their Majesties' pleasure, followed by the Chivalry meeting, then Court roughly two hours after the tourney ends. If gentles are willing to help set up on Friday, please give Orianna her email so she can contact you if the weather is too sucky to set up that night. She will need clean up help too, please, plus hall set up and clean up.

Several gentles cut out pennants for the lists at the last social meeting; Pleasance and Collette are serging them. Orianna added that she spent last Sunday driving around the campground checking out local restaurants and hotels in Batavia, Caledonia, Bergen, and Henrietta so she could post a list of them to the Æthelmarc list.

Peregrine will be out of town the weekend of Crown, but Eldjarn will serve as drop dead seneschal.

3. Rapier Academy

Keyard is still searching for more teachers, Yasmina reported, and she is still trying to schedule a meeting with the site owner to verify some things. She sent an announcement to Teresa for publication in the next AEstel, and it should be up on the kingdom webpage's calendar.

4. College of Three Ravens

Caradawc contacted Western Presbyterian, which is where we held the event last year, and they want us back. "They don't think we're too weird," he quipped, so we can use them for C3R if nothing else works out. He's still checking out a few other sites since the church's hall was a bit tight last year. Honnorica suggested trying the Norman Howard School, but Collette said that she did her occupational therapy internship there and doesn't think the school rents to people outside the school. Carlo suggested checking out the city school

system schools; Sigvaldi said they tend to have an extremely lengthy rental process. Caradawc concluded that he hopes to have something by the next meeting.

5. Chamberlain Proposal

Peregrine read Matilda's proposal to add a new office to the baronial policies and procedures, which we will vote on at the November Curia:

1.3.15 Royal Chamberlain

Serves as a deputy to the Exchequer (following Kingdom structure)

Ensure the Crown and Their Heirs are invited to Thescore events.

Communicate with the Crown and Royal retainers on behalf of event autocrats and the Barony.

Arrange for local retainers to the Royalty, as needed.

Solicit and coordinate donations for Royal gift baskets and Royalty room comforts, as appropriate.

Supervise the set up, serving and clearing of high table for feast.

Supervise the acquisition, use and maintenance of Barony property specifically designated as Royal Regalia, including but not limited to: thrones, banners, table cloths and napkins, feast gear and serving items.

Arrange for retainers for royalty, arrange for royalty room comfort, organize special baronial items for royalty, set high table

Boldo asked why the office was needed. Matilda replied that she felt we need to ensure the royalty is taken care of when they are here. We have special dishes in our stores for serving dinner to the royalty but the cooks never use them because it is not their responsibility to set high table or bring those special dishes, and they're usually too busy to handle that step. Plus, she added, not all royal couples have large cars and can bring lots of regalia with them to all events. He asked if the royalty are not coming to Thescore because this is not happening, and Matilda said no. Orianna noted that Thescore used to store some kingdom regalia; Eric said he would check the baronage stores to see if we had some kingdom things in with the baronial things. Honnorica suggested asking Steffan to check the baronial stores at his home.

6. Officer Reports

Archery: We still have practice on

Sundays, Cedric said.

Rapier: Fencing moved inside last week, Yasmina said, and we're officially in the weight room now! We're no longer banished to the hallway. She added that Phillipe and Padraig passed their dagger qualifications at Summers End. Practices now begin at 7 instead of 6:30, still on Monday. "Because the marshal is selfish and doesn't have a DVR, once Heroes starts up we will end practice at 8:45," she added with a smile.

A&S: Lots of things are still meeting, Kadlin reported. We can continue talking about recruitment at the social meeting if folks are agreeable, she said. Oh, and Summer Academy is slated for our area.

Webminister: Sorcha and Donal have made several changes to the main webpage to make it more obvious to newcomers where to go for information. Cedric is working on separate website that's "jam-packed with information" specifically for newcomers (SCA-Rochester.org). "Cedric is the brain and Donal and I are the pinkies."

Chronicler: As drop-deads, Sorcha and Donal took over the office and will finish Mairghread term; they said they plan to apply for the position when it ends in January. Mairghread said she prepared an inventory of the office's files and handed off the archives at the meeting. They apologized for the delay in publishing the September issue, but are getting the hang of the job now and are working on the October issue. "If you have any stories, or ideas for a story, please feel free to email us with them."

Exchequer: We have \$1,799.97 in checking and \$3,117.25 in savings, Alina said. We have \$800 out in advances because due to the two upcoming events.

MOL: Bronwyn said nothing is happening.

Chatelaine: Dubheasa sent her report to Peregrine, since she could not be at the meeting.

Heavy Weapons: Monday practice is now inside at 7 p.m., Vettius noted, adding that he's holding armoring workshops on Thursdays at his home (usually starting at 5:30 and ending whenever).

Youth Fighting: Nothing is happening right now, Mairghread reported, although our youth fighters have participated in several

recent events, including Summers End. Several marshals did youth events at War and had a lot of fun.

Seneschale: Peregrine reported that she talked to Joe, the Recreation Center manager, about the swipe cards. If we are only using the soccer field and not coming inside the building, we don't need to apply for one. However, anyone who comes inside for any of our activities must get one. She turned in all the forms we signed on Wednesday and should be getting the cards soon.

Baronage: Katja said she and Eric attended Summers End in Beau Fleuve and traveled to Coronation with Pleasance. They will attend Harvest Raid, Crown, and Rapier Academy, and Katja wants to attend Horses, Hawks, and Hounds.

Dance & Drum: The drummers have been routinely invited to Brass Ring each year and also attended Aaron's demo and Summers End. "So, we're getting a good reputation," Carlo said with a grin. The drummers drummed for the giants parade and the post-revel hafla at Summers End. Practice has been occurring on Mondays with the fencers and fighters at the Rec Center because "Dehka saw an opportunity to teach new dancers, and it's been working out pretty well." We will see if we continue here each Monday if we have our own room or if we go back to meeting on Wednesdays at private homes. The date has been changed on the Dance and Drum webpage, but needs to be updated on the Fewmet calendar and on the baronial webpage.

Threadworkers: Orianna will demonstrate how to drape a Greenland gown at the October or November meeting, and the date will be posted on the Thescorre list. Honnoria suggested talking to the textiles guild in the Hael about doing some joint meetings.

Brewers: We're meeting this weekend at Eldjarn's home, Sorcha said.

Scribal/Heraldry: Next meeting is the scriptorium at Pleasance's home, Collette reported, and Una may be teaching something. Next month's meeting will be heraldry.

Court and Country Dance: 7 p.m. here at the Rec Center next Wednesday, Peregrine noted. ("Why are the meetings at 7:30 when almost everything else starts at 7 p.m.?" Collette asked. Orianna and Katja noted that Thescorre's meetings have been scheduled at that time for a very, very long time. "Meetings are boring, and everything else is interesting," someone joked.)

7. Miscellaneous

Several gentles attended an English demo in the city last weekend. Mairghread said lots of people stopped and asked information and they had good contact with several interested people, including two other recreation groups from Rochester (16th Century Scottish highland group, and 13th Century medieval group). Boldo commented that "You had to really like 'Scotland the Brave' on the bagpipes because three bands played it for six hours straight." It was a really pleasant day to be out, although there was an absolutely brutal wind coming off the Lake.

Policies and Procedures

Proposal to change Thescorre Policy and Procedure by adding the following under duties of Baronial Officers

1.3.15 Royal Chamberlain

? Serves as a deputy to the Exchequer (following Kingdom structure)

? *Ensure the Crown and Their Heirs are invited to Thescorre events.*

? *Communicate with the Crown and Royal retainers on behalf of event autocrats and the Barony.*

? *Arrange for local retainers to the Royalty, as needed.*

? *Solicit and coordinate donations for Royal gift baskets and Royalty room comforts, as appropriate.*

? *Supervise the set up, serving and clearing of high table for feast.*

? *Supervise the acquisition, use and maintenance of Barony property specifically designated as Royal Regalia, including but not lim*

ited to: thrones, banners, table cloths and napkins, feast gear and serving items.

This proposal was read at the September business meeting. Discussion will be on the agenda at the October business meeting, with further discussion if necessary and a vote at the November Curia.

Baronial Offices

The following terms of office end on Jan. 1. Any person interested in applying for an office should fill out an application and get it to me. If an officer wishes to continue in the office, they should also fill out an application. The next term will extend to January of 2010 (that sounds very strange!). Applications are due by the November business meeting.

General News

Our focus on recruitment issues is proceeding slowly, however, we are making some progress. We are investigating options so that the Barony can decide which of these to focus on, and we are working on updating the Baronial literature.

We still need a bid for College of Three Ravens. Caradawc is working on one; everything is in place except a site.

Speaking of sites, the time may be right to find another meeting site. Free would be nice, but may be improbable. Please let me

know if you have any ideas. I believe Caradawc said he'd coordinate the effort, but I'd like to double-check with him before writing that in stone.

Kingdom Events

Having been approached lately regarding Thescorre's place in the Kingdom event rotation, here's the schedule as it applies to our Barony, which is in Region 4. Region 4 is in the rotation for

- Spring Crown 2008, preferred dates are the 1st or 2nd weekend in May, bids were due Oct. 1, 2007
- AE Summer Academy 2009, preferred date is the 3rd weekend in June, bids are due Nov. 1 2008

Coronations are not in the rotation, as their location is dependent on Their Highnesses' preference, however *just* in case anybody from Thescorre might be considering it,

- Spring Coronation 2008 bids are due by November 1, 2007

and

- Fall Coronation 2008 bids are due by June 1, 2008

Because Spring Coronation 2008 bids are due in just a few weeks, I hope any Thescorre bids would be ready for Baronial consideration at the October business meeting on Oct. 16. But if they are not, this piece of business may be finalized on the Thescorre email list if necessary. Preliminary discussion may certainly take place on the Thescorre list.
