## MEETING MINUTES

### 2/19/2008 Thescore Curia

Cedric & Peregrine's home  
Peregrine, Seneschale  
24 Thescoreans present

#### 1. Officer Reports

**Herald:** Fridrikr introduced himself as the new Ravenstongue Pursuivant and urged everyone to watch the Thescore Yahoo list for the locations of the monthly commenting sessions. "If you want to talk about arms, names, or badges, please contact me," he added.

**Arts & Sciences:** All is going well, Kadlin reported. There are regularly scheduled meetings for Threadworkers Company, Cauldron Bleu Cooks Guild, Scriptorium, Raven Raqs Beladi (Middle Eastern Dance) and Drumming, and Crow's Feet Dance Practices. The Ravensong choir has been reinstated under the direction of Eilionora. The Threadworkers are working on a kingdom banner that can be used by the royalty when they visit Thescore. The cooks have been helping

Katrina and Collette prepare for the lunch and dinner for the College of Three Ravens, as well as making cookies for upcoming peerage vigils. Both Raven Raqs Beladi and Ravensong plan performances at C3R.

She added that the December Social meeting was attended by only a few gentles due to the inclement weather, and the January one was cancelled since it fell on New Year's Day. "At the February social, Fridrikr gave a presentation on rubrics and how they are used at Ice Dragon, which was followed by a Q&A/roundtable discussion. Orianna followed with invaluable advice about the Ice Dragon Pentathlon as well as competing in individual categories. Hopefully this helped encourage more Thescoreans to consider entering Ice Dragon."

Kadlin is encouraging gentles to wear garb and share snacks at upcoming social meetings, but neither is required. Gentles are also encouraged to bring in projects they are working on to display/discuss. Her goal for the near future is

to focus on the types of activities available in Thescore. Heads of guilds, groups, and/or projects will be asked to give a presentation/demonstration about what they do, and when possible, have those in attendance at the meeting participate in a mini project (ex. calligraphy/illumination basics, court vs. collegial heraldry, learning what to watch for in a fencing/fighting bout). Please contact her off-list or talk to her at meetings if you are willing to present or have suggestions for presentations you would like to see.

**Exchequer:** We have \$1,725.82 in checking and \$3,157.82 in savings, Alina said. There are several cash advances outstanding, due to C3R. She reminded everyone that, per kingdom law, cash advances must be cleared within 30 days of receiving them.

**Fencing:** We held a rapier event with 91 attendees in November, reported Yasmina, which had a loss of \$118 but gained a lot of "holy cows" about the site and possible plans to use it for fu-

ture events. (She added that fencers were still talking about the site at Feast of the Seven Deadly Sins.) She is considering submitting a bid to use the site for Known World Academy of the Rapier, but not for another two years. After inventorying all the fencing equipment for the steward update, Yasmina requested funds for new blades, gloves, and other equipment. The Threadworkers offered to sew loaner hoods and gorgets, and she has a large bolt of material from Pleasance for the hoods, so now we just need patterns and needle power. She has \$30 left from buying the equipment, she noted. Some of the hardware won't fit the schlaeger blades, so she wants to use the remaining money to buy tips and guards. She needs some wood workers to help her make new sword grips. Yasmina added that she has updated the inventory with the new equipment, there have not been any injuries at any of the recent practice, and we have a new marshal-in-training, Phillippe.

**Chatelaine:** Sigvaldi is filling out the remainder of Dubheasa's two-year term. We did several demos recently, including several nights of gift-wrapping and drumming at Borders Books & Music, and RunningGAGG. We were asked to "provide color" at a corporate event but decided this was outside our purview, he explained. Dubheasa's job has asked us to do a demo/fundraiser on May 8th, and the schools likely will begin asking us soon to do ADEPT demos, plus SimCon is coming up soon (last Saturday in March). We have several projects that we started recently but haven't finished them. "It is perhaps a good time to put some effort into completing these projects once C3R is wrapped up. Projects would include the editing of the SCA/Barony literature, sorting/re-organizing/adding materials to the demo-box, repair and supplementing the gold-key inventory, and recruitment."

Dubheasa offered some more information about the fundraiser, which will be from 6 to 8 at Ontario State Beach: no

one has to pay to get in because we're volunteers, and we won't pay for food either. The food will be damn good, and mostly period, she added. There won't be any fighting or fencing at this time because it's an indoor event and those activities would prevent the guests from milling about. They do welcome singing and dancing. She needs an idea of how many people will attend.

By the way, she will happily accept clean citrus peels from everyone, since she's making candied peels for the event. "There goes the kitchen..." Vettius groaned. "It's only for 400 people, it's okay," Dubheasa replied.

**Heavy Fighting:** We have practice every Monday at the Center, Vettius reported. We've had a lot of large attendances, especially since Khalek won Crown, he said. "On average, we have 10 to 20 people in armor every practice, which is more than I have seen in years. I want to keep this excitement going after the reign."

**Archery:** We've had two contests in the past couple of months, Cedric said, one for Christmas and one for Valentines Day. (Eldjarn designed the last shoot.) We've been shooting at Creekwold Archery. The start times can fluctuate a lot according to the site's own competitions, so I post every week to confirm the practice time. Eldjarn is training to be an archery marshal, he added.

**MOL:** The only activity in the last three months was at Rapier Academy, Bronwyn said, where she ran the list for a competition.

**Thrown Weapons:** Athos has agreed to be the new marshal. He noted that he threw everyday for the past three years, but hasn't recently because of a small accident. He said he would let gentles know when he's throwing again "so people can shoot with me if they want."

**Royal Chamberlain:** Orianna has been thinking about how we're going to set up high table at C3R, and she's also busy thinking about Coronation and Ice Dragon.

**Chirurgion:** Carlo and Phillippe have finished the new website! He helped out at F7D.

**Webministers/Chroniclers:** The website will be undergoing several updates soon behind the scenes, reported Sorcha and Donal. We would like a webpage for each guild and welcome help with this. The newcomer-oriented website, SCA-Rochester.org, is going well, but we could use more photos, please. Since the last Curia, we've had 13 new subscriptions and three unsubs. Overall, we are slowly working our way into this position and hope everyone is satisfied with what we are doing. They asked everyone to please send in articles -- It would be nice to share what everyone is doing.

Lastly, "we have been mailing four print copies out each month. It's usually only one stamp per issue, although one issue needed two stamps and if we start getting in more submissions, the norm may be two per issue. Even then, it's only \$3.28 per month, so we haven't been too worried about asking for re-imburement."

**Steward:** "We have stuff. It lives in the basement," Steffan reported. He now has a current inventory of barony equipment and plans to get it on the website. "The road signs are living in the garage right now -- they were muttering something about 'we are outdoor devices and the basement is too cramped and we miss the scent of motor oil and gasoline'. (They are a bit damaged after all). So, I let them stay in the garage. They do note that they are lonely because there are only six of them now, and that it might not be enough of a crowd to be able to handle directions to an oddly placed site. So I am asking for a small quantity of money (\$50) to build an additional half dozen signs."

Siggy noted that Diane's husband makes vinyl signs, and may be able to make signs to us for little or no money. Vinyl signs, he added, are extremely durable, roll up small so they store more easily, and can be strung on stakes in the ground or attach to wooden frames. He offered to talk with Steffan and Diane's husband to discuss this possibility. Oh, and he also does bumper stickers and window-cling

stickers! So, we could have new baronial arms stickers. Those present agree to table the \$50 request until all those involved talk.

**Seneschale:** The SCA ads have started on WBER, Peregrine said, but we have no idea if we're getting any hits off it. She has proposed several changes to the baronial policies, including standardizing the wording for the marshals' duties, the A&S officer's duties, and that of autocrats. Those present voted 23-0-1 to approve the various proposed changes. Peregrine plans to have the policies reprinted soon.

She had one other proposal, regarding the turn-over of offices when an officer steps down due to an emergency situation. Currently, the policy states the officers' designated deputy may fill the office; she would like to change the wording to the deputy may complete the end of term, since the selection process for a new officer can take a long time. Since this change is more substantial, she said, she will hold off on proposing this one until the July Curia so folks can look at the language.

**Baronage:** Katja reported that she and Eric participated in two of the Borders demos in December, then attended Æthelmearc Twelfth Night in Endless Hills in January and had a very nice time. Later that month, she went to the Heralds & Scribes Collegium in Sterlynge Vayle "and had a very nice time," especially at the classes and the hysterical Moot Court. They also hosted a weekend food-prep session of the Cooks Guild during the month. In February, they attended F7D, and hosted another cooks guilds. They have not attended as many practices as they normally do in the past three months due to the holidays, traveling, and work, but they have gone fairly regularly to choir practice and fencing/fighting/dancing & drumming on Mondays. They are looking forward to C3R this weekend!

**Scriptorium:** Practice has moved to Roberta's, Collette said. We need some money so that we can buy some Pergamenta; we have a lot of Bristol Board,

but we prefer to use that only for practice. We can get 50 sheets for \$150, then cut each of the sheets into at least four or more scrolls, so this will hold us for a long time. Those present approved the request 23-0-1.

Cauldron Bleu Cooks Guild: "Come play with food," Bryn smiled. Collette needs help making bread dough on Saturday night for C3R, and Katrina will need help in the morning frying the hunshurr. Once we're past the event, the guild plans to bake cookies for upcoming vigils. In addition, Bryn said, we're planning practices focusing on cheese, vinegars, sugars, mustards, and spices. Want to know more about an aspect of medieval food? Contact Bryn. **Brewers:** We expect to meet next month, Eldjarn reported, and we hope to meet with the cooks in the near future.

**Threadworkers:** We will meet at Cyas' home in Victor on Sunday, Orianna announced, to continue working on the banner. We'll also talk about upcoming projects, like sewing loaner hoods for the fencers. She asked if plans were progressing for sewing dels (Mongol coats)? Yes, Katja remarked: Roberta has agreed to host a del patterning workshop at her home the Saturday after Ice Dragon. More information coming!

## 2. College of Three Ravens

"We have three onboard reservations left," Matteo announced, saying he was available to take reservations. A few minutes later he announced he had sold the last one, and would start a waiting list.

The event is in three days and everything is looking good, Caradawc said. We have 45 classes planned, we're going to be allowed to use the Sanctuary for Court (although no food or drink is allowed in there), and feast and lunch plans are going well. He asked for help setting up on Friday and cleaning up on Saturday.

## 3. Baronial Champs

Sigvaldi presented his bid for the event on Memorial Day weekend at Diane & Tom's home in Hemlock, which is half

way between Livonia and Geneseo. They have several acres of land that they will let us use, including a nice section of field for a walking shoot and access to woodlands for fighting, fencing, thrown weapons. Plus, there's a firepit for a bardic circle. Since it's a private home, it's not only a wet site, he added, "it's saturated." They will allow us to camp there Saturday night (the staff can camp on Friday night). Siggy said the expenses would be portajohn rentals, and food for the dayboard (probably \$100 for the dayboard and \$200 for the privies.) He is scheduling a walk-through of the site after Ice Dragon. Diane & Tom have had an annual pie party for over 80 people on their land before, so they know they can host a large gathering like Champs. He noted that parking will be somewhat limited, so most gentles will end up parking along the road. He asked Fridrikr to serve as tollner, and has contacted all the marshals and champions to plan the tournaments. Those present approved the bid 22-0-2 pending a final budget by the social meeting

## 4. Pax Interruptus

Eldjarn presented his bid for Pax on June 27 to 29, which is the weekend between Academy and July 4th. He's proposing using Genesee Country Campground again, and is expecting an attendance of 120 or more. He has asked Bryn to be the head cook, Donal to serve as reservation clerk, Bronwyn to be MOL, and all the marshals have signed on. The site cost is \$700, he expects lunch to cost \$150, and a single portajohn is \$100. He proposed \$7 per adult, camping \$6 per night, and \$6 feast, with prices halved for minors (under 18). He estimated a profit of \$69 if we have only 120 (with 10% minors). He noted that we had only 113 attendants last year, but there were no royals and the date of the event was earlier than normal. "Since we'll have royals this year, hopefully we'll have more people." Fridrikr asked him to consider setting a family cap, but Eldjarn expressed concern about it causing a very small margin of error. After

some discussion, those present approved the bid 22-0-2 contingent on a final budget.

## WATER FELTING FOR KIDS

Felting has been around for thousands of years and it is something that children can do. This class will teach you how to turn plain wool fiber into pieces of felt that you can cut out, sew together and make into neat things. Here is how to make your own felt with just some wool, some dish soap and a disposable pie pan or plastic plate. You can use larger containers to make bigger pieces of felt as well!

**Step 1:** You will need about ½ ounce of clean and carded wool fiber divided into 3 parts. Spread the first portion out evenly in the bottom of the pan so that it is completely covered. Spread the second layer evenly cross wise (so they make a +). Spread the third layer in the same direction as the first.

**Step 2:** Lightly drizzle a small amount of detergent over the fibers. Gently pour ½ a cup of hot water over the wool. (Only use as hot as you can handle.)

**Step 3:** Carefully push down on the wool with your hand flat, getting out the air bubbles and add more water until the wool is completely covered. Push down around the edges matting the fibers.

**Step 4:** Using you one hand to hold the pan, place the other flat on the wool with your palm in the center and fingertips at the edge. Gently move your hand in small circular motions on the wool, rotating the pan slowly until the wool firms up. About 5 minutes. After this you can start working in faster circles for about 10 minutes.

**Step 5:** Carefully (over a sink or pot) drain out the water and flip the wool. Add more soap if needed and more water to cover the wool. Repeat step 4.

**Step 6:** To rinse the felt, run warm water over the wool in the pan and pour out the soapy water. Now turn on the cold and rinse the rest of the soap out of the felt while pressing it down into the pan until all the soap is gone. You should now have felt.

**Optional Step 7:** If you want to make your wool stronger and more durable run hot water over it while you roll and squeeze it. The more you do
